The Chair initiated a discussion on the timing and location of the next SIAG/APDE Conference APDE 13.

The two locations which received the support of the majority of participants are:

1. Puerto Rico 2. Orlando.

Puerto Rico as a possible location for the next meeting was seen as an enticing choice, offering an exotic atmosphere while not having any of the visa issues and less of the cost issues which graduate students and young immigrant faculty may otherwise suffer.

The participants agreed of the necessity that the meeting is scheduled at a location which provides access to a large, international airport so that the participants have the choice of possibly direct flights.

Other desirable locations suggested were Atlanta and Philadelphia.

Next, the question of the timing of the conference was addressed. The participants agreed that scheduling the conference in December instead of November is preferable. It was also pointed out that there is no real advantage to having the conference organized within the summer period because there are a lot of conferences organized in Europe during that period.
